VIEWFINDERS: A School to Museum Program 2017-2018



THE VIEWFINDERS PROGRAM is an elementary school partnership program active in many Indianapolis schools. The program offers teacher training in Visual Thinking Strategies (VTS), which is a facilitated arts-based method that develops students' vocabulary, reasoning, and critical thinking skills. Though the discussion is about a work of art, the skills that students develop as they make observations and support their ideas with evidence are relevant in all subject areas.

Additionally, Viewfinders connects teachers with a year of VTS curriculum for use in the classroom, offers IMA staff for school site visits, and engages classes in VTS-specific field trips to the IMA campus. These serve as a capstone to the VTS experiences throughout the year.
